- ▶ Regular Delegate: 600 Euro
- ▶ Student: 250 Euro\*
- ▶ Accompanying person's fee: 80 Euro

(\*) The number of students participating at a reduced fee is limited to 50. The selection will be based on the submitted abstract presented by the student.

- ▶ The delegate fees includes the conference information folders, participation in all sessions, coffee/tea, the welcome reception and the conference dinner.
- ▶ The Accompanying person's fees includes the welcome reception and the conference dinner.
